

Light Crime Statistics.

The annual criminal return to the House Office, as affecting the Greta Bridge Petty Sessional Division, contains some very gratifying features. To begin with there are no indictable offences, which is an encouraging and praiseworthy fact. There is no case of felony included in the statistics. which is a remarkable feature because it is an unprecedented circumstance. Sixty-six persons were proceeded against for minor offences, and, while one charge was withdrawn, four were dismissed, and sixty-one convicted. The total number of people fined was fifty-two. Nine individuals were apprehended, including two brothers for an aggravated assault, and who were committed to prison without the option of a fine, and seven vagrants.

Still More Hopeful.

THERE is a reliable consensus of local public opinion that the holidays which are now over have been characterised by a marked absence of excess. Sensible recreation rather than silly carousal has been strongly in evidence, and an overwhelmin. majority of the people have chosen refind entertainment and instruction in preference to the gratification of debasing passion. Superintendent Cameron, on the one hand, and Inspector Gatenby, on the other-each representing a wide police division-have declared that there has been an almost entire absence of drunkenness, and this testimony is borne out and emphasised by the railway officials, who, of course, have an excellent opportunity of gauging public behaviour at oliday times. Nothing could be more encouraging, and nothing will more quick! gladden the heart of the philanthropist than experiences of this kind. But we are quite aware that virtue is not a mushroom that springs up of itself in one night, when we are asleep, or regard it not: but, on the contrary, a delicate plant that grows slowly and tenderly, needing much pains to cultivate it, much care to guard it, and much time to mature it. Neither is vice a spirit that will be conjured away with a charm, slain by a single blow, or despatched by one stab. Nevertheless, by the force of example. and the popularising of evil-counteracting agencies, and elevating and refining the tastes of the populace, public decorum is helped and encouraged.

Now and Then.

It is interesting to note that William Fordyce, in his History of the County of Durham, says, of the inhabitants of Barnard Castle, that the town "has produced some individuals whose talents would have graced progress of refinement, and more especially the introduction of railways, have, of course. extended themselves as civilizing agencies into this as well as into other and more remote districts of the country; and the courtesies of life are as well understood, and as gracefully practised in and around this town, as they are generally amongst the educated classes of society.
