Mrs J. J. Bell-Irving has made provision for the reception of fifteen wounded men at Rokeby Hall.

Major Chichester Constable, of Stangey Lodge and Wood Hall, Constable Barton, has with his son Cecil, and his other son who is in India, volunteered for active service.

The non-commissioned officer in charge of one hundred recruits who arrived at the barracks, Barnard Castle, on Thursday night, in addressing the party, said a number of the recruits would be billeted in the town, and the military authorities looked for exemplary conduct in the hotels.

Captain and Mrs C. E. Hunter are in residence at Womwargill Hall, and only a few days for the table were shot on the opening day.

Mr Frederick Milbank, who has been staying at Cliff's Hall, and a limited number of guns, have had three days' excellent game shooting on Barningham moors.

The Belfast spinners are only working twenty-eight hours per week, and the first day will probably be the only one available commencing next season.
