AN APPEAL TO TEESDALE MEN.

TRUE to its traditions, the little agricultural town of Barnard Castle has not only contributed handsomely to His Majesty's fighting forces, but it is at this moment the home of two Kitchener regiments. The capital of Teesdale has sent units to the front who have distinguished themselves for bravery. Hardly had they set foot in France than they were motored direct to Ypres, and took up their position in stemming the onrush of the Hun in a memorable battle. Cool, steady and determined, they faced the foe, and their heroic deeds will long live in local military annals. With such a lead as this one would have thought that the young men of Teesdale generally would have emulated their fellow-dalesmen in swelling the ranks of the defenders of their native land, for unquestionably Great Britain is fighting for her very existence at this moment. Teesdale youths are crack shots, and we cordially ask them very carefully and very seriously to consider the situation in the light of the recent recruiting campaign. Our appeal is by no means put forth in any reproachful spirit, and we are most anxious that this fact should be clearly understood. We simply invite careful thought as to patriotic duty, remembering by way of encouragement, that Barnard Castle has given about 500 of her sons to His Majesty's general forces. Conscription is already in the air, and, in order to obviate compulsory service, we invite all young men who are eligible to enlist at once. Never let it be said that they were forced to join the colours. It will be a bright chapter in English history if it can be writ largely that Britons fought for civilization against barbarism with purely voluntary armies. The only argument that can be understood by the Germans is force, and this, to us, means more men, and still more soldiers.

An additional boy of our own belonging to the 10th Leicestershire Regiment arrived at Barnard Castle by the 5-41 passenger train from Darlington on Friday night.

Some of the American papers are discussing the possibility of Dr. H. J. West, among the pastors of Westminster Chapel, has refused to say anything to his visitors. He has, however, left New York, England with Mrs. West and their six children.

A week on Friday it will be one hundred years since the battle of Waterloo was fought.

There were offerings of eggs at St. John's Church, on Sunday last, for wounded soldiers.

Mr. Lodge, Egglestone, reports that two dozen fresh eggs have been forwarded to the National Egg collection for the benefit of our wounded sailors and soldiers.
