"B AGHOAD AND GERMANY'S INTRIGUES."

Canon Parfitt at the County School.

A most instructive and realistic lecture was delivered at the North Eastern County School on Frider night, by Canon Parfitt, a series of lanters slides relping successfully to illustrate Eistern topography and architecture, and to typicy the manners and enstons of various anticalities, but, above all and beyond all, victoring Germany's intrigue and cunning. Mr J. G. Hall, J.P., and Mrs Hall. Mr R. T. Richardson, J.P., the Rev. A. W. Sewart, Brignali, achool examiner: Mr John Robson, Mrs J. H. Holmes, Mies Cookson, drs Broretor, Miss Drammed and others were present, the assistant-masters and boys assembling in full numbers in the large school-room.

The Rev. F. L Brereton, M.A., in a few introductory sontences, said Canon Partit had resided and worked in the East-in Syria and Palestine-for twenty years before the War, and came to them in a peculiarly interesting way as the exponent of knowledge gained by

direct experience.

for her expansion eastwards, in the deepening of cacals, the joining-up of rivers and the making of railways through Asia Minor to the Persian Gulf. Lord Montagu, as they had sear, bad fereshadowed the sending of mails to India from London in three to five days, by perfected air service. Germany sontemplated the opening of a corridor from the North Sea to the Persian Gulf, and, in developing the Asiatio provinces of Turkey, au ideal railway service had been projected from Berlin to Baghdad, the journey to be encompassed in eight days. The Lecturer enlarged upon the vich alluvial depozits in Mesopotamia, the irrigation schemes, and the possible growth of two crops in one year. The Vicercy of India had declared that it was a veritable Garden of Rden, and in torse sentences Canon Parfitt dealt with the characteristics of Erzerum, Mosul, Bagbdad, Bassa and Koweit, which is on the Persian Gulf, and Alexandretta and other notable places. In an elequent passage the distinguished missionary sketched the hereic fight put up by General Townshend, and declared, in the midz's of enthusiastic applause, that the gallant soldier, notwithstanding his capitulation at Kut, yet saved the situation on the Indian frontier. The Lecturer featured the tomb of Ezekiel and the Tower of Babylon, with fine allusions to antiquities associated with Nebuchadnezzar, the Babylonian Monarch. In choice sentences the learned travellar described the attributes and scenery of the Tigris and Euphrates, and enlarged upon the dwellings and the life and idiosyncrasics of the reople. Whilst the foca of Great Britain had been trampling down little nations, England had valiantly supported the cause of the weaker states, and the action of the Allies bad made a tremendous impression on the Eastern races, while civilization had been rescued. Passionately sincere was the scholarly Can n in emphasising the darkest plot in this terrible War-the diabolical attempt to arouse in Pan-Islamism a Holy War. and goading on the Turks to a descent on the Sucz Canal and Egypt. He thanked High Heaven that the intrigue failed in so far as the Mahammedan population of our Indian Empire were c ncerned, and then was screened a truly marvellous photograph, representing tens of the usseds of Moslems in devous prayer for the success of the English arms. Is was pertainly a most remarkable exhibition of fealty and legalty, and was of a truth a memorable feature in a never-to-be-forgotten

The Headmanter, in thanking the Lecturer in the name of the boys, said he was gaite sure that all of them personally had been not only interested, but they had learned a great lesson. He concluded: "We shall go out of this room this evening realising, as none of us have realised before, what is the character of this glorious struggle in which this country and this empire is involved. We realise better than we did before how intense our danger has been, how i terse has been the struggle, and how confidently we, on our side, may trust in God, and persevere in doing the right."

The boys then accorded the Lecturer three rousing "North-Easters," and Canon Parfitt suitably replied.

A Letter from a Barnard Castle Man a Prisoner in Germany.

What He Says of German Treatment.

Private J. Simpson, 76, Galgate, Barnard Castle, who is a prisoner in Germany, writes to his mother under date January 1st, 1917, from Kriegs-Gefangenenlager Wahn (Rhld.), as follows:-"Just a few lines hoping to find you all quite well, as it leaves me at present. I had a good Christmas here, and I was alright. I am still in hospital, but am almost hatter. They have good doctors here. thick I can get English money changed. am now able to walk about. I expect to see all my friends armeday, although if I hadn't heen treated so well by the Germans I would have said good-bje. But keep your heart up, as my wounds were not very serious. One on the arm and another on my hip gave me the most treuble, the others being only small. Altogether I had eight wounds, but they are all healed up, or thereabouts.
