**LOCAL AND OTHER NOTES.**  
Father O'Leary left Darlington on Saturday night for Brough Hall, Catterick, where he is succeeding Father Kennedy as private chaplain to Sir John Lawson, Bart. Father O'Connell, of Whitley, has taken up duty at Darlington. Father Kennedy is proceeding to France as an army chaplain. The Rev. J. C. O'Leary is very highly esteemed in this neighbourhood.  
Second-Lieutenant F. Fowler, of the Royal Flying Corps, is now in hospital in London, suffering from injuries sustained while photographing over the German trenches. The gallant soldier, who was a cadet in the North Eastern County School Officers' Training Corps, is the brother of Mr Fowler, of Cleatham. Lieut. Fowler most fortunately is alive, though his machine was literally smashed to pieces.  
In Sir Douglas Haig's mentions occurs the name of temporary Lieutenant R. H. Helmer, of Romaldkirk.

Second-Lieutenant Francis Somerled J. Silvertop, great-great nephew of the Right Rev. Monsignor Witham, formerly of Darlington Hall, and of Minsteracres, Northumberland, is announced to have been killed in action on May 20th. Born in 1883, the deceased officer was the eldest son of Henry Thomas Silvertop, and married in 1916 Frances Nevill, younger daughter of Mrs George L. Foster Harter, of Salperton Park, Gloucestershire. In 1904, the late Lieutenant Silvertop attained his majority, and in the month of August there were birthday celebrations at Darlington which are still memorable. The deceased gentleman was a graduate of Trinity College, Cambridge, and, after holding a commission in the Northumberland Hussars, he was gazetted to another regiment of Yeomanry in the first weeks of the war. On the sale of the estate the deceased gentleman did not sever his entire interest in the district, because he reserved the Lordship of the Manor of Darlington, which will devolve on the late officer's son.

During the autumn and winter working parties have been held at Whorlton, and also many in the parish have worked at home. Funds, too, have been collected, with the result that the following garments have been made:—40 shirts, 120 pairs of socks, 1 pair of hose tops, 12 pairs of slippers, mittens, gloves, scarves, 70 hospital bags, etc. The work has been sent to a receiving hospital at Southampton, Lady Smith-Dorrien's Bag Fund, War Work Depot in Durham, soldiers on foreign service, and all the men from the parish who are abroad have received a special parcel.  
Mr Willie Todd, of Barningham, son of Mrs Todd, of Fairview, is now a cadet, in training for an officer, at Aldershot. Mrs Todd's second daughter is a nurse at the County Hospital, York, and her youngest daughter, whose husband was killed in France, in January last, is a nurse at a Gravesend hospital. Mrs Todd's grand-daughter (daughter of the late Mr Johan Johanson), is also at the hospital at Gravesend, all being very capable and acceptable nurses. It is interesting further to note that Mrs Todd has also two grandsons in the army—Johan Johanson, the eldest son of the late Norwegian Consul at Glasgow, who married the eldest daughter of Mrs Todd, about twenty-six years ago, and who got his commission in January, 1914, is an officer in the Indian Army. The second grandson volunteered when the war began. No one, we think, can doubt the patriotism of the Todd family in all its branches.

The awful and even tragic romance of this cruel war is shown in the fact that Mrs Todd's married daughter (Mrs Johanson), of Glasgow, went to Norway with her late husband in May, 1914, hoping to return in September, as they had done for many years. But hostilities broke out, and they were not able to get back, or, rather, to risk the journey. Mr Johanson died in Norway in 1916, and his widow, with the two youngest sons, very fine, big boys, sixteen and twelve, are still in the land of the midnight sun.  
Lance-Corporal Thomas C. Lawrence, 1st Middlesex Regiment, only son of Mr and Mrs William Lawrence, formerly of Barnard Castle, and grandson of the late Mr William Kellett, of Marwood Cottage, has been awarded the military medal, and promoted on the field for conspicuous bravery.

In the Darlington branch of the National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children 10 cases were dealt with during the month of April, affecting 38 children.
