THE NURSING ASSOCIATION.

At a meeting of the General Committee of the Barnard Castle and Startforth Nursing Association held in the Dispensary on Saturday morning, in view of a letter which appeared in last week's issue of the Teesdale Mercury, a unanimous vote of confidence in the officials of the Association was passed.

Preliminary steps were taken for the equipment of a second nurse. A letter was read from the Secretary of the Durham County Nursing Association commending the steps and stating that "Health visiting and maternity cases are the functions of the Nursing Association. If we are to progress and do the best work, we must co-operate with the Public Health Department. Preventive work must be linked up with the curative."

NEWS OF THE UPPER DALE.

(By our correspondents.) MARRIAGE OF DR. DAWSON AND MISS PETTLER.

Middleton Primitive Methodist Church was crowded on Thursday morning for the wedding of Miss Gertrude Irene Pettler, younger daughter of Mrs. Pettler, Meadow View, Middleton, and the late Rev. Charles Pettler, Primitive Methodist Minister, and Mr. Robert Dawson, M.A., M.B., Ch. B., son of Mrs. Dawson and the late Alexander Dawson, Aberdon, and assistant to Dr. Beadle, Middleton-in-Teesdale.

The bride, who was given away by her mother, wore a dress of ivory crepe-de-chine trimmed with Chinese embroidery, with veil and wreath of orange blossom and white heather, and carried a bouquet of pink roses and white heather. The bridesmaid was Miss E. H. K. Haunus, who wore a dress of coral-rose Georgette with silver head-dress, and carried a bouquet of tea roses.

The groomsmen were Mr. Daniel S. Dawson, B.Sc., F.I.C. (brother of the bridegroom). The Rev. T. C. Showell officiated, assisted by the Rev. C. F. Broad, Wesleyan Minister.

The service was fully choral, the choir being in attendance under the leadership of Mr. F. Lowe. Mr. T. C. Osborne, F.R.C.O., organist at the School for the Blind, London, where Miss Pettler has been a teacher for some time, was at the organ, and played the Wedding March and several other pieces. The church was beautifully decorated. After the ceremony a reception was held at Meadow View, the home of the bride, when about fifty guests were entertained. The health and future happiness of the bride and bridegroom were proposed by the Rev. T. C. Showell and supported by the Rev. C. F. Broad, the bridegroom responding in an appropriate little speech. The health of the bridesmaid was proposed by Mr. Trotter, the groomsmen responding. The health of the parents of bride and bridegroom was also expressed by the Rev. H. C. Perrott, Rector of Middleton-in-Teesdale, and Dr. Beadle. Later in the day the bride and bridegroom left by car on route for the Teesdales, where the honeymoon is being spent, the bride travelling in a two-piece suit of coral-rose blue crepe and crepe-de-chine, with hat to match. In the evening the members of the choir and several young people of the Church were entertained to supper by Mrs. Pettler, at Meadow View. The presents were numerous. The bouquets were afterwards placed at the foot of the war memorial.
