FIRE AT HULANDS QUARRY.

The L.N.E.R. fire engine and brigade from North Road station were summoned to a fire at Hulands Quarry, near Bowes, on Monday, but when the engine and tender reached Barnard Castle station it was found that they were not needed.

The trouble started with a leaking tar tank at the quarry, the escaping liquid catching fire and causing a big blaze. There was a fear that the flames might spread to where other inflammable substances are stored; hence the summoning of the fire brigade. However, after three-quarters-of-an-hour's fight with the flames the workmen at the quarry, with the use of sand and water, got the fire under control and there was no need for the brigade.

As a matter of fact, thanks to the way the workmen dealt with the matter, the damage was practically nil. But in the meantime rumour had been running riot. We had a message from Middlesbrough asking whether it was true that Barnard Castle railway station was on fire!
