Dave Brown is highest scorer

Barnard Castle came home with a good 5-4 victory after visiting Stanley in the darts superleague.

Dave Brown was named man of the match. He won his singles 2-1 with an average of 24.89.

The team won the doubles, then suffered two 2-0 defeats at the start of the singles. N. Robson went down with an average of 17.02 and G. Kirby lost with figures of 17.35.

A. Gowland won 2-0 with an average of 20.87 before A. Ford went down 2-0 with 16.48.

But following Dave Brown's win, K. Brown rounded it off with a 2-0 victory, averaging 21.31.

Is Clint Yorke the finest cricketer ever to play for a club in Dale?

After three seasons as Evenwood professional Clint Yorke played his last game for the club in the Alf Smith Cup final and scored his 16th century.

He made 113 not out against Crook Town in a 30 over match. The game ended in a tie, and Clint's bowling and fielding matched his wonderful batting.

In 1988 Evenwood engaged Ian Bishop as pro but he was called up for the touring West Indies. He has since become one of the world's best fast bowlers.

It was fortunate for Evenwood that Ian recommended Clint, a friend and team mate from Trinidad and Tobago, as his replacement. Clint's achievements are incredible. Having him as pro more than made up for losing Ian Bishop.

He amassed amazing statistics and records. He is without a doubt one of the best cricketers the Durham County League has ever seen.

In his first year he scored 2,029 runs including four centuries, took 97 wickets and held 27 catches. The next season saw 2,268 runs, five centuries, 98 wickets and 26 catches.

This season he scored 2,429 runs, seven centuries, took 128 wickets and held 24 catches.

The club's previous best totals were 1,380 (four centuries) and 121 wickets in a season. His total of 6,726 runs place him as the third leading run maker in the 25 year history of the club.

Clint holds the following batting records for Evenwood: Highest ever individual score 210 not out (v Sedgfield, a league record); most scored off one over, 30 in the same match; most sixes in a match, 12; most fours in a match, 26; most runs in a season, 2,429; most 100's in a season, seven; most 50's in a season, 16; most sixes in a season, 54; most 100's in the history of the club, 16; most 50's in the history of the club, 42.

He is the only person to score six successive 50's, the previous best being only three. He is the only person to score over 2,000 runs in a season. Clint took 323 wickets and stands as ninth all time wicket taker. With 128 wickets this season, he achieved the coveted 100 mark and beat Billy Teesdale's club record.
